


Projects in pipe-line (Future plans)

I Water Resource Management

Depleting reservoirs and groundwater can put water supplies, human health, and the environment at serious risk. Lower water levels can contribute to higher concentrations of natural or human pollutants. By this Project, Using water more efficiently would help in maintaining supplies at safe levels, protecting human health and the environment.

Proposed Key Objectives:

- › Arrest decline in ground water levels
- › Reduce the evaporation losses
- › Overcome the inadequacy of surface water to meet demands
- › Awareness Generation through IECs & Trainings on water conservation and safe drinking water



II Implanting Viable Farming Techniques

Green revolution has helped the country increase grain production from a modest 50 million ton in 1950-51 to 209 million ton in 2000. However, the increase has come by promoting chemical fertilizers and high yielding variety seeds. This has led to the loss of crop varieties, erosion of genetic diversity and extinction of local seeds. Further increase in the use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides and high-yielding variety seeds have led to degradation of the soil and increase in the cost of farming.

Proposed Key Objectives:

- › Increase in Income via cost effective Agri practices
- › Adopt Natural & Advanced agricultural practices
- › Understanding on dry crops and water scarce
- › Practice of Soil and Water test before Plantation
- › Promote natural Compost in place of Fertilizers



III Saving Dignity of Women

Due to prevailing social taboos, women are paused from household decisions and even from community level participation as well. In view of Poor Gender-representation in country, the decision making capacity amongst women is trifling. Consequently, they are tortured for unfair Dowry demands, sometimes they are beaten to death also. Sexual Harassment and Murder cases are on a rise across Rajasthan (as far as the cases relating to Dowry, Sexual Harassments & Murders are concerned, till date 13740 cases are still pending as per Forensic Science Lab, Jaipur).

- › Enhance the worth and Dignity of every woman
- › Coordinated public response and preventive strategies through creative communication
- › Build awareness to challenge ideas, belief, any practices which cause and perpetuate to lead violence against women at family, household, community and state level
- › Gain an overview of the sex ratio and its decline in the country
- › Consultations to discuss strategies employed by various organization in curbing the phenomenon
- › Suggest a positive approach to curb Sex Discrimination & Harassment in the State
- › Identify areas of further research on this issue




IV Promotion of Universal Primary Education
